

All about SCOIR!

SCOIR will play a pivotal role in the logistical part of your college process this SCOIR fall and winter because we use it to submit the documents supporting your application. You'll need to be in and out of your account regularly, making sure that your college counselor understands your plans. There is no rush, but if you feel ready and eager to cross some items off your SCOIR "to do" list, here are some tasks you can complete now:

- 1. Fill out the Senior Questionnaire. It can be found in the Surveys section of your SCOIR account. Also fill out the Activities and Achievements section so that we have a full account of your extracurricular record, which we can represent in our recommendation letter.
- 2. Remind your parents to complete their Parent Response Form which is in the Surveys section of their SCOIR account.
- **3. Update your college list to reflect your plans.** If you have lost interest in certain schools, move them to "Not Interested." If you have identified some schools that you plan to apply to, feel free to move those schools over to the "Applying" Column.
- 4. Have you noticed that colleges are signing up for visits? Although there are just a handful scheduled right now, in the end we will probably have over 100 colleges set up a time to talk with interested Thayer seniors. Feel free to sign up for these visits as they appear. The meetings will be scheduled weekdays between 3:30 and 5:00 p.m. and at 7:00 p.m. throughout the fall. We will dive deeper into this resource in another Virtual Brickyard later this month.

Some of you have inquired about setting up your SCOIR account for the submission of the supplemental parts of your application (teacher recommendations, transcript, etc). For now, you don't need to worry about any of that. The good news is that you will meet with your college counselor for a full period in September to go through all elements of your college process, including the mechanics of putting the pieces together. In the near future, when we feel like everyone (teachers and students) is ready for this next level, we will communicate instructions. Until then, you can sit tight.
